### **SAMA-ALTOONA TO HOST SUMMER ART CAMP**

Altoona – The Southern Alleghenies Museum of Art at Altoona will continue its tradition of offering a children’s art camp this summer. This year’s camp, “Adventure into the Illusion of Op and Pop Art,” is designed for ages 8 through 14 and will be taught in a small, informal group to provide campers with exposure to a museum setting, as well as ample opportunities to work with a variety of artistic media.

The camp will be led by SAMA-Altoona administrative assistant and part-time instructor at Penn State Altoona, Stan Snyder. During the camp, students will learn professional drawing and painting techniques in order to develop their own Op and Pop Art masterpieces. At the conclusion of the camp, the students’ work will be on display at the Museum.

The two-week camp will be held from 12:30 to 3 p.m. weekdays July 28 through August 8. Cost is \$125 per child, which includes art materials and snacks. Registration requires a \$25 non-refundable deposit and must be received no later than July 23. For registration or more information, please call the Museum at (814) 946-4464.
